The Maine Technology Institute (MTI) awarded the Environmental and Energy Technology Council of Maine (E2Tech) with a \$392,700 Cluster Initiative Program (CIP) grant to promote its members, help Maine cleantech companies compete nationally and globally, and implement business and economic development strategies to help accelerate commercialization of clean technologies, products and services.

“I am working with an exceptional set of partners and businesses to accelerate the growth of a sustainable clean technology sector in Maine,” said E2Tech Executive Director Jeff Marks. “E2Tech is positioned to significantly enhance future success in commercializing alternative energy and environmental technologies.
